C6. Admission Policy

U.S. Applicants: UVSC has an open admission policy, under which virtually all secondary school graduates or students with GED equivalency diplomas are admitted without regard to academic record or test scores.

Foreign Applicants: UVSC accepts international students who can provide the following information (an international student application can be requested by calling the International Admissions Office at [801] 863-8475):

1. An application (must be 18 years or older for admittance).
2. A Contract of Support form for an International Student at Utah Valley State College, showing \$11,200 for one academic year (8 months). A parent or sponsor must fill out this form. Other documents may be attached but this form is required. However, if the applicant is paying his/her own fees, a bank statement may be substituted showing at least \$11,200 in U.S. funds, on deposit, under the applicant's name.
3. Transcripts showing completion of U.S. level high school.
4. The \$100.00 non-refundable application fee in U.S. funds.
5. A TOEFL or Michigan Test, unless the applicant is enrolling in English as a second language.
6. If the applicant is transferring from another U.S. institution, then the previous school must fill out and send a NOTICE OF INTENT TO TRANSFER form.

C8. Entrance Exams

1. UVSC does not require SAT I, SAT II, or ACT scored for admission decisions. However, UVSC does recommend that either the SAT I or ACT test be taken prior to applying to the college.
2. The applicant's SAT I or ACT test score is used for placement and counseling, particularly in Math and English courses. If the entrance exam scores have not been submitted to the college when the applicant attempts to enroll in classes, the college requires the applicant to take a series of tests covering Math, English, and Reading comprehension. The results from this on-site testing will then be used to counsel and place the student into appropriate courses.
